Great Parks of Hamilton County Fishing Event Rules & Descriptions

All tournaments are two-person team events, and individuals are permitted to fish alone. A maximum of two rods are permitted per angler in all events except the Bass tournaments where only one rod may be used. Only artificial lures are permitted in the Bass tournaments, live bait is permitted at all other events. Stringers are prohibited in all tournaments. Teams must have their team ID bobber on the tournament board before the end of the event in order to weigh their fish. The Kid's Derby and Mystery Fish Challenge are not tournaments and prizes are awarded to every kid who fishes. Fishermen can enter tournaments onsite the day of the event.

Bass Series:

Teams fish for a five bass limit. Fish must measure 12" or more, and must be weighed and released alive. Short fish and dead fish will not be weighed. All ties are broken by the biggest fish weight. Awards are given to the top three place teams at each event based on greatest weight. The top 20 anglers in the point standings qualify for the Series Championship. The overall points leader is crowned angler of the year.

Kid's Mystery Fish Challenge:

These events are intended for children under 16 years of age, accompanied by an assisting adult. Live bait is permitted. Prizes will be awarded in 3 age groups to the kid who weighs a fish in closest to the mystery fish weight. Any species of fish can be weighed. Trophies will be awards to every kid who catches a fish.
